

# Teck Highland Valley Copper End Land Use Plan

## WHAT IS AN END LAND USE PLAN?

The reclamation program at Highland Valley Copper (HVC) is guided by an End Land Use Plan that was developed in 1998. The plan identified four general post mining land uses; agriculture, wildlife, mixed use – agriculture and wildlife, and aquatic. These land uses were mapped using map units across the footprint of the mine at closure, and reclamation plans were prescribed to help achieve the goals.

## CREATION OF NEW PLAN

Highland Valley Copper will be holding a series of community workshops in 2015 to engage the Nlaka'pamux First Nation communities in the development of new End Land Use Goals for the mine site. We welcome Nlaka'pamux band members to be part of the process and provide input on the development of the plan.
