An exciting opportunity for First Nations post-secondary students, FNIGC's National Student Bursary will award **two \$2,500 bursaries** to First Nations college or university students enrolled in one of these fields of study:


- Epidemiology,
- Population Health,
- Biostatistics, and
- Information and Data Management Technology.

This year, as an added incentive the bursary recipients will also be given **free registration to "The Fundamentals of OCAP®"**, FNIGC's online OCAP® course developed in association with Algonquin College (a \$250 value).

The deadline for applications is September 30, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. EST.

FNIGC conducts unique data-gathering initiatives, such as the First Nations Regional Health Survey (FNRHS) and First Nations Regional Early Childhood, Education and Employment Survey (FNREEES) and soon



a national survey process called the First Nations Regional Employment Labour Survey.

These surveys provide an abundance of information, research, training, data collection, analysis and dissemination services to First Nations at the community, regional and national levels. The surveys also allow us to build culturally relevant portraits of the lives of First Nations people and the communities they live in. FNIGC recognizes that quality information - information that is collected by First Nations people for First Nations people - has the power to change lives by influencing knowledge based decision-making and inspiring effective policy and programs for all First Nation communities.
